ORDER


This case came before the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Commission on December 8, 2022, pursuant to a Notice of Preliminary Hearing in accordance with O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-6(b)(10)(A) and 21-5-6(b)(10)(B) and Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. r. 189-2-.03(6). Respondent Khadijah Abdur-Rayman (hereinafter “Respondent”) appeared *pro se* in front of the Commission.

The Commission hereby finds that **there are reasonable grounds to believe** that violations of the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Act **have occurred, to wit:**

1. Respondent violated O.C.G.A. § 21-5-30 when she accepted contributions prior to filing a Declaration of Intent to Accept Campaign Contributions.
2. Respondent violated O.C.G.A § 21-5-34 thirty times when she failed to disclose contributions and expenditures made by her campaign.
3. Respondent violated O.C.G.A. § 21-5-33 thirty-nine times when she made expenditures that were not utilized to defray ordinary and necessary campaign expenses and were converted to personal assets.


The Commission hereby **ORDERS** that the above-styled case shall be referred to the Georgia Department of Law for further prosecution under the Administrative Procedure Act in accordance with O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-6(b)(10)(B) and 50-13-13.
