ORDER

This case came before the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Commission on December 8, 2022, pursuant to a Notice of Preliminary Hearing in accordance with O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-6(b)(10)(A) and 21-5-6(b)(10)(B) and Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. r. 189-2-.03(6). Respondent Khadijah Abdur-Rayman (hereinafter "Respondent") appeared *pro se* in front of the Commission.

The Commission hereby finds that <u>there are reasonable grounds to believe</u> that violations of the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Act <u>have occurred</u>, <u>to wit:</u>

- Respondent violated O.C.G.A. § 21-5-30 when she accepted contributions prior to filing a Declaration of Intent to Accept Campaign Contributions.
- 2. Respondent violated O.C.G.A § 21-5-34 thirty times when she failed to disclose contributions and expenditures made by her campaign.
- 3. Respondent violated O.C.G.A. § 21-5-33 thirty-nine times when she made expenditures that were not utilized to defray ordinary and necessary campaign expenses and were converted to personal assets.

Order

The Commission hereby ORDERS that the above-styled case shall be referred to the Georgia Department of Law for further prosecution under the Administrative Procedure Act in accordance with O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-6(b)(10)(B) and 50-13-13.
